ARE YOU SET?

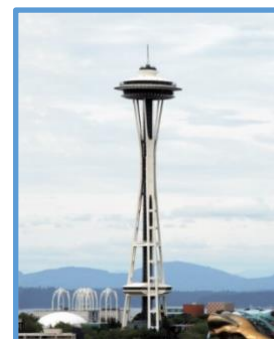
- To learn how to start making plans for your career and life after high school
