Camp Helen Keller: Where Abilities Shine

A Specialized Summer Experience That Sparks Joy and Builds Independence

Since 1953, Camp Helen Keller has provided a transformative summer experience where children ages 4-16 who are blind or have low vision discover their potential through thoughtfully designed activities, peer connection, and expert support.

Located on the Long Island University Post campus, our program weaves together recreation, education, and skill development. Every activity serves multiple purposes:

- Building physical and emotional confidence
- Developing creative expression and fine motor skills
- Fostering social connections and communication
- Enhancing independence that extends beyond summer

Through our integrated approach, campers don't just have fun – they discover what's possible while developing crucial life skills that serve them in school, home, and community settings.



Creating Without Limits Where Imagination Takes Form

Arts and crafts with an innovative and adaptive approach: Using raised-line drawing boards, textured materials, and specialized tools, campers explore painting, sculpture, and mixed media projects.

Each project is thoughtfully designed while encouraging creative expression. Counselors guide campers in techniques that also translate to home and school settings, while projects often connect to broader camp themes - from nature exploration to cultural celebration.

The arts studio becomes a space where vision loss doesn't limit creativity, and where every child can experience art and bring their imaginations to life.





Rhythm & Movement

The magic of music and dance

Our music and dance program creates an engaging environment where children explore rhythm, sound, movement, and self-expression.

Counselors guide campers in vocal performance and dance choreography, fostering coordination, balance, and spatial awareness through adaptive techniques that accommodate various vision abilities.

The program culminates in our end-of-summer showcase, where campers share their achievements with family, friends, and community supporters. The performance celebrates their artistic growth and demonstrates how these activities develop essential motor skills and improved orientation and mobility while providing new avenues for self expression.





Jump In!

Where Every Child Belongs in the Game

At Camp Helen Keller, we transform traditional field games, sports, and recreational activities into accessible experiences. Using tactile boundaries, auditory cues, and modified equipment, children experience the excitement of soccer, kickball, jump rope, relay races, and team sports in a safe and welcoming environment.

Each activity is carefully structured to develop core physical abilities while building life skills. Campers gain spatial awareness, refine mobility techniques, and develop communication strategies that transfer directly to school and community settings.

The confidence gained on our playing fields extends far beyond camp, empowering children to participate in physical recreation in their home communities with greater independence and self-assurance.



Making Waves Swimming Builds Confidence

Our swimming program provides a unique sensory experience that builds both physical skills and emotional confidence. In the indoor pool on the LIU Post campus, campers discover freedom of movement and independence in water—often a transformative experience for children with vision loss.

Instructors adapt swimming techniques to each camper's abilities, ensuring everyone has fun while gaining water safety and swimming skills. Beyond the fun, swimming develops core strength, spatial awareness, and orientation skills that transfer to daily life

For many of our campers, participating in swimming activities is a significant summer achievement that creates lasting memories and builds profound selfconfidence.



Exciting Field Trips

Adventure Beyond Boundaries

Our field trip program takes summer camp beyond campus with engaging excursions that challenge expectations and build confidence.

Camp Helen Keller's field trips provide campers with exciting opportunities to explore new environments and activities. From horseback riding at Lloyd Harbor Equestrian Center to conquering rope courses and zip lining at Adventure Park, each carefully planned excursion combines excitement with accessibility.

Campers also enjoy the dynamic activities at Urban Air Adventure Park, where they experience trampolines, climbing challenges, and other highenergy activities, many for the first time. Each success builds confidence that extends far beyond the summer, showing our campers that adventure is within reach.

Our exceptional 3:1 staff-to-camper ratio ensures individualized attention and support throughout the summer. Each staff member undergoes comprehensive training in adaptive techniques, safety protocols, and accessibility strategies.

Many of our counselors have backgrounds in special education and a passion for helping others, while some bring lived experience as individuals with vision loss themselves. This diverse expertise creates a uniquely qualified team that understands both the challenges and possibilities our campers face.



Celebrating Achievement Our Annual End-of-Summer Show

The culmination of five weeks of growth, our showcase lets campers shine through performances that demonstrate their new skills and personal development.

The end-of-summer showcase brings together families and friends to witness how their children have flourished at Camp Helen Keller. Through musical numbers and dance routines, campers demonstrate their newfound confidence on stage – from leading songs to performing choreographed dances.

Each performance represents a personal triumph, showing just how far our campers have come and what they can achieve. We are regularly joined by local community members, government officials and press at this annual celebration.

Meeting Critical Program Needs

Our funding model combines public support through the New York State Commission for the Bind (NYSCB) with essential private philanthropy. While NYSCB covers 30–40% of operational costs, we must raise approximately \$120,000 annually to maintain program quality and accessibility.

This gap in funding represents a meaningful opportunity for community partners, philanthropic organizations, other foundations, and individual donors to directly impact children's lives through targeted support of specific program components.
